



## THE FALL

	Genesis 3		
Memory Verse	Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us. And lead us not into temptation. Luke 11:4		
Context/Background	The first two chapters of Genesis describe God's perfect creation. In the garden of Eden there was perfect harmony between humans and other creatures. Their differences complemented one another and did not lead to fear and suspicion Similarly, man and woman complemented each other and lived in harmony. All creatures lived happily under God.		
Summary	Sadly, this ideal state did not last. Through the serpent, sin entered the world. The devil's method of tempting the woman was typical of the way he works, and it has been repeated throughout history. His subtle questions raised doubts about what God had said, and challenged God's truthfulness and motives. Eve fell into the trap. She began to question God's warning about the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (2:7). The knowledge Adam and Eve gained through eating the fruit did not bring happiness; it brought disharmony, guilt, and shame. However, God did not renounce or annihilate his creation. He spoke the first gospel message when he announced that the woman's offspring (Christ) would crush the serpents head (Genesis 3:15). Christ would defeat the devil. (GROW Kids FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT Genesis 3 How sin came into the world)		
Relevance/Application	Themes: love, justice, forgiveness		
Younger students:	<ul> <li>Adam and Eve were tempted by the snake, who persuaded them not to listen to God's instructions. The devil also tempts us not to listen to God.</li> <li>Sin has caused great harm to us and to the world. Only God can repair the damage.</li> <li>God gives us his law to help keep us away from sinning.</li> <li>God sent Jesus to save people.</li> <li>God's love continues for people even when we do wrong or when things go wrong.</li> <li>We can say sorry to God for our mistakes and he will forgive us.</li> </ul>		
Older students:	• When Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit, sin entered the world. People no longer lived forever but were condemned to live lives of suffering and death as a consequence. The whole of creation was thrown into brokenness, and each one of us is born 'sinful and unclean'.		

	<ul> <li>Sin leads to internal turmoil within ourselves (Rom 7:19), broken relationships with others, and it also has a profound effect on human relationships with all of creation. Nature now tends to work against human beings (Gen 3:17–19) and can unleash massive destruction. Human beings also abuse their mandate to take care of and preserve creation.</li> <li>Because God is holy, just and loving, he cannot simply ignore human sin. Sin has its consequences. However, already in the Garden of Eden when sin came into the world, God's ultimate response to sin was clear. His plan was to show his love and mercy to all of his creation, and his promise of a saviour (Gen 3:15) was fulfilled in Jesus Christ.</li> </ul>

Catechism Connections	In the Lord's Prayer we say: Lead us not into temptation. By praying this, we are asking God to help us not to do anything that is wrong. We are asking God to lead us the way he wants us to go. To lead us away from doing bad things. This is really hard and that is why we keep praying this prayer over and over again.		
Discussion/Wondering Questions:	<ul> <li>Early Years <ul> <li>Do you ever do naughty things? Why?</li> <li>Have you ever made someone else sad?</li> </ul> </li> <li>Adam and Eve were naughty and that made God sad. When we do the wrong thing or hurt someone, what should we do? (say sorry, say sorry to God)</li> </ul> Primary <ul> <li>What did God say would happen to Adam and Eve if they ate from the tree in the middle of the garden?</li> <li>What did the serpent (snake) say would happen?</li> <li>What does it mean to be tempted?</li> <li>What helps you make the right decision?</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>What helps you make the right decision?</li> <li>Secondary <ul> <li>Sin affects our relationship with God. When you know you have disobeyed God in some way, how do you feel toward him and about things like listening to him, praying and praising God?</li> <li>Sin affects our relationships with other people. How is your relationship with others affected when you lie or cheat or are jealous?</li> <li>How do other people's sins affect you?</li> <li>Talk about how people's greediness has caused damage to the environment and our ability to live in harmony with nature.</li> <li>In Romans 6:23 it says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Compare</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		
Images or objects to spark discussion	<ul> <li>A big red shiny apple and a snake</li> <li>Two treats – one that students have permission to eat, and another which you tell them they may not eat. Ask them whether the one they can't have seems more desirable because it's not allowed. Ask them to imagine that the forbidden treat is poisoned. How do they feel about it now? Make the connection that temptations are often very attractive, but that they can have serious consequences.</li> </ul>

Activities	<ul> <li>Early Years: <ul> <li>Draw or colour in pictures from the story</li> <li>Teach the children this rhyme based on Humpty Dumpty: Adam and Eve in the garden one day, Listened to what the snake had to say. Sin came into the world that day; No-one but Jesus can take it away.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Primary: <ul> <li>Give students whiteboards or tiles and have them write their sins on them with whiteboard markers or washable crayons. Point out that ever since Adam and Eve, all people sin, and our sins have consequences. But the really good news is that Jesus paid the price for our sins, and so when we believe in God and say sorry for our sins, we are forgiven. Jesus washes us clean! Use dry erasers or pour water over the tiles to wash away the sins.</li> </ul></li></ul>
	<ul> <li>Upper Primary/Secondary:</li> <li>Draw a ripple diagram, showing how sin has a ripple effect – starting within individuals, then affecting personal relationships, then the wider community and then all of God's creation. Don't forget that Jesus died to pay the price for all our sins. You may like to create an alternative ripple diagram with God's love at the centre instead of our sins. How does God's love affect individuals, relationships, the community, the world?</li> </ul>
