NOAH'S ARK

Genesis 6–9

Memory Verse

"In God I trust; I will not be afraid." (Psalm 56:4)

"It was faith that made Noah hear God's warnings about things in the future that he could not see. He obeyed God and built a boat in which he and his family were saved. As a result, the world was condemned, and Noah received from God the righteousness that comes by faith." Hebrews 11:7 (Good News **Translation**)

Context/Background

After Adam and Eve ate the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil things began a downward spiral. Humanity multiplied and violence reigned. Cain killed his brother Abel. One of Cain's descendants, Lamech, became a man renowned for violence, boasting his exploits (Genesis 4). Sin and evil were only intensifying. How would God react to this state of

Just before the story of the flood begins, we learn that "the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5) and it grieved God "to his heart" (Genesis 6:6). Summary

Noah was a righteous man living during a time when wickedness and corruption had engulfed the earth. In response to this, God decides to bring a great flood to cleanse the earth. God instructs Noah to build an enormous ark to save himself, his family, and representatives of every animal species. Noah faithfully follows God's commands, constructs the ark, and gathers the animals. When the floodwaters rise, Noah and his family are protected inside the ark for forty days and nights until the waters recede. After the flood, God makes a covenant with Noah, promising never to destroy the earth by a flood again.

Relevance/Application Themes: Sin, grace, hope, forgiveness, justice, courage

Younger students:

- Even when we don't understand God's plan, we can trust Him to fill our lives with the blessings and resources that we need.
- God provides us with a way to begin again when we make mistakes.
- God rescued Noah and his family, and promised never to destroy the world with a flood again.
- God sent Jesus to rescue everyone. When Jesus comes again the whole world will be made new.

Older students:

- Faithfulness and Obedience: Despite societal corruption and doubt from others, Noah's commitment to God's word demonstrates the importance of faithfulness and obedience in one's relationship with God.
- **Divine Judgment and Grace:** The story depicts God's judgment on humanity due to their wickedness. However, amidst the judgment, God extends grace and provides a means of salvation to Noah and his family. This reveals God's mercy and compassion, highlighting the opportunity for redemption and a fresh start.
- Covenant and Promise: God establishes a covenant with Noah after the flood, symbolized by the rainbow, as a promise never to destroy the earth in such a manner again. This covenant showcases God's faithfulness to His word and His love for humanity.
- Noah's Ark foreshadows Jesus Christ and the redemptive plan of salvation. Just as Noah and his family found refuge in the ark, believers find salvation in Jesus. Jesus is the ultimate fulfilment of God's promise to provide a way of salvation, as He sacrificed Himself on the cross to save humanity from sin and eternal separation from God. The ark's role as a vessel of rescue parallels the role of Jesus as the Savior who offers salvation and a renewed relationship with God.

- How would you have felt if you were Noah and had to gather all the animals?
- Why do you think it was important for Noah to follow God's instructions exactly?
- How can we show faithfulness and obedience to God in our own lives?

Secondary

- Why do you think God decided to bring a flood to cleanse the earth?
- How would you have reacted if you were Noah and people around you didn't believe in the flood?

- Discuss the significance of the rainbow as a symbol of God's covenant with Noah. What does it represent?
- In what ways can we see parallels between Noah's Ark and the story of Jesus' sacrifice for humanity?
- How does the story of Noah's Ark challenge our understanding of God's love and His relationship with humanity?
- Explore the concept of the covenant between God and Noah. What does
 it mean for us today? How does it impact our understanding of God's
 faithfulness?

Images or objects to spark discussion

- A boat
- Mark out a space in the school/local area about the same size as the ark; 134 metres long ×22 metres wide ×13 metres tall. Imagine what it would be like to build such a huge boat by hand, and what it would have been like filled with animals.





Activities

Early Years:

- Paper Plate Ark: Provide students with paper plates, construction paper, and craft sticks. Have them create their own miniature ark by decorating the plate as the boat and using the craft sticks to represent animals.
 Encourage them to retell the story using their crafted ark.
- Make a cardboard box ark big enough for children and stuffed animals/toy animals to walk through two at a time.

Primary:

- Diorama Creation: Assign small groups of students to create dioramas depicting scenes from the story of Noah's Ark. Provide materials like shoeboxes, paper, clay, and mini figurines. Encourage them to think creatively and include details that reflect key elements of the story.
- Rainbow Mobiles: Guide students in making rainbow mobiles using colourful
 construction paper and string. Each colour of the rainbow can represent a
 different part of the story or a specific theme. Discuss the symbolism of the
 rainbow and its connection to God's covenant with Noah.

Upper Primary/Secondary:

• Storyboard Creation: Divide students into pairs or small groups and ask them to create storyboards of the key events in the story of Noah's Ark. Provide drawing paper, markers, and other art supplies. Encourage them to include dialogue or captions that reflect the story's themes and lessons.
